



ST. MARK'S LUTHERAN CHURCH, corner of Fifth and Walnut has a seating capacity of 180. Rev. H. A. Reischauer who arrived in June of 1955 served the congregation until November of 1965. Rev. Kenneth Jenks, current pastor, answered the call in January, 1966. Earliest records of the congregation show activity as early as 1907. Serving the congregation in its earlier history from 1925 through 1954 were pastors H. W. Rabe, W. F. Theiss, E. L. Burgdorf, A. F. C. Pfothenauer and H. A. Reischauer.

## St. Mark's Unveil Building Program



Plans for a new addition to the present building of the St. Mark's Lutheran Church have been announced and a drive for funds is already underway.

The new addition, which will cost \$150,000, is to be south of the present building on Fifth Avenue. It will provide 11 to

14 classrooms, two large assembly rooms, a fellowship hall with kitchen facilities for large dinners and convertible to sports and stage presentations.

The present building was renovated and modernized at a cost of \$50,000 in 1956. It was

formerly the First Methodist Church of St. Charles and when the congregation moved to their new Baker Memorial Church in 1954, the church was given to St. Marks Lutheran. Rev. C. K. Jenks is the pastor of the church and the president of the congregation is Richard Scent.
