FROM THE DESK OF THE PARISH NURSE

BEE STINGS

This is the time of year when we see a prevalence of bees, especially as uninvited guests at our outdoor activities and around trash bins and the time of year when most stings occur. Following are a few simple tips to avoid bees, their painful stings and complications (which can be lethal) and some simple treatments for bee stings.

Typically, bees are not aggressive creatures. Their stingers are for defense, not attack. Traditional insect repellents are of no use in preventing bee stings. Effective prevention means not attracting bees and not frightening them if they are present.

To avoid bees try the following:

- Avoid fragrances, including hair spray, scented soaps, lotions and oils. Bees usually approach children with a sweet scent.
- Don't wear brightly colored clothing, especially floral prints.

- Be very careful with food and cans of soda. Bees climb in cans of soda unobserved. Something as small as a raspberry jam stain on clothing can also attract a bee.

If a bee does land, avoid frightening it.

- Hold still. Tell kids to pretend they're statues, rapid movements startle the bee and encourages stinging.
- Try blowing gently on the bee to encourage it to move on without startling it.
- Wear shoes to protect your feet if you should step on a bee.
- Wear long pants, especially in a field.
- Wear a hat. It's been proven bees have a lower threshold for stinging people with hats.

Treating the sting:

- Remove the stinger as quickly as possible (a small black dot) with a tweezers, fingers, or scraping with a credit card.
- Clean the area with soap and water
- Applying an antiperspirant with A aluminum Hydroxide may reduce the effect of the venom.
- Apply ice or cold water for 30 minutes after the sting to blunt the body's allergic response.
- An antihistamine such as Benadryl, taken by mouth, may give some added relief
- Calamine lotion or a paste of baking soda and water may be helpful as well as topical hydrocortisone.
- Tylenol or Ibuprofen will provide systemic pain relief.

Bee stings cause immediate painful red bumps. In most cases the pain usually subsides within 2 hours and the swelling the next day. Local reactions, larger than 3 inches, may persist up to a week.

Systemic reactions such as hives, swelling, or redness elsewhere on the body, vomiting, dizziness, hoarseness, thickened speech or difficulty breathing should receive immediate medical treatment from a physician. Also, be sure to see a doctor if there were 10 or more stings or if one of the stings was in the nose or the mouth.

St. Mark's Church Council Meeting Minutes

Date: July 9, 2008

President Bob Vaca opened the council meeting at 7:00pm

Present: Bob Vaca, David Jeziorski, Margaret Studer, Bob Acton, Pattie Macklin, Claire Giovenco, Chris Chinn, Robin Butler, Pastor Silber

Opening Devotions were led by Robin Butler followed by the opening prayer led by Pastor Silber.

Comments from the Chair: Bob Vaca

Bob told the council that he will be out of town for the week of Jul 26 2008 and will not be available

Board of Evangelism: Margaret Studer

A meeting will be held Saturday for all committees involved in Evangelism. The purpose of the meeting is to discuss evangelism goals, focus and activities.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Silber

Pastor Silber discussed Ablaze with respect to member participation. Pastor Silber said he feels it is important for the Ablaze ministry to be a church emphasis. Sep 28 2008 is the Ablaze rally at NIU. Sylvia Hemmann is looking into the possibility of space for Joe Boway. Tickets for the rally are free but you do have to have a ticket. Tickets are available online. Margaret Studer agreed to obtain tickets when necessary. A committee will be formed to make plans for activities at St. Mark's. Pastor Silber thanked everyone for their help with staff appreciation day.

Board of Trustees: Chris Chinn

Chris passed out the Trustee Report for June. Chris also distributed the Facility Usage Policy. He indicated that the document was current but dated. A discussion followed on use of the Narthex and exchange of money. Who, what, when applies? Concerns include defining the Narthex area and fund raising policy. The council will consider the contents of the Facility Usage Policy and table further discussion until the Aug 2008 meeting. Chris also discussed the AED training that will be provided. Pattie Macklin volunteered to contact Thrivent for additional funding for the training if needed.

Board of Elders: Bob Acton

Bob indicated there was no meeting this month to date. The next meeting is scheduled for next Monday. It has been brought to Bob's attention by Linda Schroeder that there were no more 120 minute tapes for use by the shut in ministry. It was discussed that this had been an Elders responsibility. Bob said he would look into providing the tapes. Bob announced that Chris Cudworth will attend the Elders meeting on Monday to report on the activities of the Praise Leader Search Committee.

Board of Discipleship: Pattie Macklin

The Discipleship Committee met on Jul 7 2008. The committee is working on plans for the church picnic which is scheduled for August 24, 2008, at Wheeler Park. Consecration Sunday is scheduled for November 9, 2008.

Approval of Minutes: Dave Jeziorski

Dave announced that he experienced catastrophic computer failure and lost the file containing the minutes for the Jun 2008 meeting. He has re-constructed the minutes as best he can from memory and asked for council members present at the meeting for input based on their notes and recollection of meeting activities. The approval of the Jun 2008 meeting minutes was tabled until the Aug 2008 meeting.

Treasurer's Report: Susan Meyer

Susan Meyer was not able to attend the council meeting. The Treasurer's Report was distributed in her absence. There were no questions or discussion about the report. Motion to approve by Robin Butler. Second by Margaret Studer. Motion passed. It is believed that Susan will be at the congregational meeting Jul 20 2008 to cover the Treasurer's Report. David Jeziorski agreed to check with Susan to be sure.

Board of Education: Robin Butler

Robin said that there is no formal report although the board has met this month. The board is addressing the nursery staffing issue. The intent is to man the nursery. To this end, an announcement will appear in the next Spirit asking for volunteers to help staff the nursery. VBS planning is in progress. Robin noted that volunteers are not signing up and neither are parents enrolling their children for VBS. Only 46 have registered so far. Last year saw 60 – 80 children attending. Margaret Studer suggested extending invite to Lazarus House. Maybe also special needs children. Pastor Silber was asked to make announcements for VBS at all services to which he agreed. Deadline is Sunday but that can and probably will be extended. No deadline will be mentioned as part of the announcements.

Old Business:

Bob Vaca: Chris Chinn will replace Pattie on the Nominating Committee. The committee members then will be the outgoing members plus Chris. Claire Giovenco asked that she also be replaced since she is currently serving on the Praise Leader search committee. Robin Butler agreed to contact Werner Schagunn to see if he would take Claire's place.

Bob Acton mentioned that Werner had commented on making improvements or changes since Congregation Meeting attendance is down. Overall volunteerism is also down. These need to be added to the prayer list.

Pattie Macklin discussed that she and Margaret Studer have been asked to run the Fan into Flame/Ablaze ministry. They have talked to Pastor Weidler on such things as how to establish the financial goals. It has been suggested that they should be based on 2007 donations. Pattie explained that Fan into Flame is the financial part of Ablaze which funds Ablaze activities.

The NID goal is \$100M. \$30M has already been pledged. Donations will not go through the church but via NID. 15% will be returned to church for discretionary use. Committee planning is in progress for activities to support Fan into Flame. Dick Sonntag will involve the children's choir. Bob Acton mentioned that this could present a stewardship challenge for members. Please put this on the prayer list. Pastor Weidler is to preach at St. Mark's on Sep 28 2008.

Claire Giovenco:

Claire mentioned that she has received member requests for a combined / unified service again such as the one held for the 100 Anniversary. Bob Acton said he would take this request to the Elders. Pattie Macklin asked about obtaining child's table for the Narthex for use when kids participate in the hospitality table. Claire responded that is a work in progress. She intends to borrow from the pre-school. The council agreed with Claire's suggestions and told her to proceed with the arrangements including re-arrangement of the Narthex. Bob Vaca recognized Claire for her work on Staff Appreciation Sunday. The council echoed Bob's sentiments.

New Business:

Claire Giovenco:

Staff Appreciation Sunday went very well. The Praise Leader Search committee has held 3 meetings so far. The old job description has been updated and the committee is now able to advertise the job opening. Discussion followed on how and where to find praise leader candidates. Dave Jeziorski and Jim Neidlinger have agreed to help with internet resources. Pattie Macklin suggested organist organizations. Robin suggested NID website for pay recommendations. Margaret suggested Trinity Roselle as resource.
